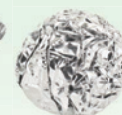

2014 STREETS AND HIGHWAYS INFORMATION AND COLLECTION SCHEDULE

YARD WASTE COLLECTION

FIRST WEEK IN APRIL- SECOND FRIDAY IN OCTOBER

- Yard waste must be placed at the curb by 7 AM (6 AM during summer months) on the scheduled collection days OR after 10 PM the night before.
- Yard waste shall be placed in open containers or biodegradable bags weighing no more than 75 pounds.

Acceptable Items Include:

- Tied brush and branches no longer than 4 feet in length with a diameter no more than 3 inches. **BUNDLES MAY NOT** be tied with tape or wire.
- Grass clippings, twigs, leaves, and other loose yard waste.

Do Not Include:

Logs, stumps, stones, dirt, fruit, seaweed, clumps of grass, treated wood chips, root balls, acorns, and other large debris. These **WILL NOT BE COLLECTED** and must be disposed of by the homeowner.

Yard Waste Collection Days:

Tuesday - North side of the Metro North Railroad/New Haven Line to Eastchester Road, Beechmont Drive, and Barnard Road

Wednesday - North side of Quaker Ridge Road to the Scarsdale Border

Thursday - Eastchester Road, Beechmont Drive, and Barnard Road, both sides and north to the South side of Quaker Ridge Road

Friday - South of the Metro North Railroad

Holidays: When a holiday occurs on any of the collection days, Monday is the alternate collection day.

After the second Friday in October residents are responsible for disposal of any remaining yard waste. Sanitation trucks will not collect yard waste. Yard Waste should not be mixed with fall leaves.

STORM CENTER HOTLINE

To report downed trees after a major storm call the DPW/Streets at **235-4029** during business hours 7:30AM -3:30 PM. After hours call the New Rochelle Police non-emergency line at **654-2300**.

FALL LEAF COLLECTION

OCTOBER 14TH- END OF DECEMBER (weather permitting)

Leaves must be placed in 30-40 gallon biodegradable paper bags or loose in containers, none of which weigh more than 75 lbs. **OR** raked to the curb and placed in long wind rows.

Curbside

- Leaves should not be placed in the street where they would impede the flow of traffic or in front of fire hydrants or catch basins
- Leaves placed in plastic bags or leaf piles that are mixed with other debris (twigs, branches, garbage) **WILL NOT BE REMOVED**

Bagged

- The department provides citywide pick up of bagged leaves on the six Saturdays listed below. Bagged leaves must be placed at the curb on those Saturdays by 7 AM. No appointment is necessary.

2014 Bagged Leaves Pickup Schedule:

November 8th, 15th, 22nd

December 6th, 13th, 20th

The City of New Rochelle encourages mulch mowing as a preferred alternative to raking and bagging leaves. For benefits and information see page 4 .

STREET SWEEPING

- Street Sweeping is discontinued for Alternate Side and residential areas during the leaf collection season. Parking restrictions however remain in effect.
- Alternate side of the street restrictions are suspended for the period of January 1 - March 31 on those streets listed in the City Code.

ALTERNATE SIDE PARKING REGULATIONS CLEAR THE STREETS FOR SWEEPING. PLEASE OBSERVE THE PARKING RULES IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD.

SNOW EMERGENCY REGULATIONS

- Property owners or occupants must keep sidewalks and fire hydrants clear and clean from snow, ice and dirt.
- Snow and ice must be removed from sidewalk abutting their property and fire hydrants before 12 noon of the day after any snowfall which occurs during the night.

IN THE EVENT OF A SNOW EMERGENCY, ALL VEHICLES PARKED ON A SNOW EMERGENCY ROUTE MUST BE REMOVED.

After the Storm... Stormwater Management

What we do on land eventually affects our water resources



What is stormwater runoff?

Stormwater runoff occurs when precipitation from rain or snowmelt flows over the ground. Impervious surfaces like driveways, sidewalks and streets prevent stormwater from naturally soaking into the ground.



The effects of stormwater runoff

- Polluted stormwater runoff entering the Long Island Sound and our City's lakes, ponds and streams can harm plants, fish, animals and people.
- Debris such as plastic bags, six pack rings, bottles and cigarette butts wash from storm drains into waterways, polluting and endangering aquatic life.
- Sediments cloud water, and excess fertilizers remove oxygen, destroying aquatic habitats.



- Insecticides, pesticides, paint solvents, used motor oil and other auto fluids can poison aquatic plants and animals.
- Polluted stormwater can affect drinking water sources.

Stormwater Pollution Solutions

In and around your home

- Recycle or properly dispose of household products that contain chemicals, such as insecticides, pesticides, paint solvents, and used motor oil and other auto fluids. Don't pour them into the ground or into storm drains.
- Sweep up litter and debris from sidewalks and driveways, especially around storm drains.

Lawn Care

- Excess fertilizers and pesticides applied to lawns and gardens wash off and pollute streams. In addition, yard clippings and leaves can wash into streams.

- Don't overwater your lawn. Find the amount of water your lawn needs using **United Water's ET Lawn Watering Guidelines** www.unitedwater.com/et-lawn-water.aspx



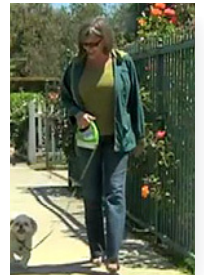
- Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly. Use organic mulch or safer pest control methods whenever possible.
- Compost or mulch yard waste. Mulch mow through the City's "**Love 'Em and Leave 'Em**" program. newrochelle.leleny.org

Auto Care

- Washing your car at home and dumping automotive fluids into storm drains sends them directly into our waterways.
- Use a commercial car wash, or wash your car in your yard so the ground absorbs the water.
- Repair leaks and dispose of used auto fluids and batteries at designated drop-off or recycling locations.

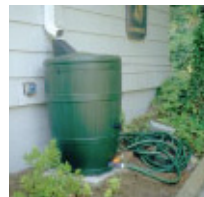
Pet Waste

- Pet waste can be a major source of bacteria and excess nutrients in local waters. When walking your pet, pick up the waste and dispose of it properly.



Residential Landscaping

- Concrete and asphalt don't allow water to soak into the ground. Permeable pavement systems allow rain and snowmelt to soak through, decreasing stormwater runoff.
- Collect water from rooftops in Rain Barrels, and use for watering lawns or gardens.
- Divert rain from rooftops or paved areas into a Rain Garden, planted with native plants.

Love 'em and Leave 'em initiative for reducing organic yard waste.

The City of New Rochelle's "Love 'Em and Leave 'Em" mulch-mowing campaign is a sustainable alternative to raking and bagging that will add valuable material back to lawns and gardens. The benefits of mulch-mowing (shredding in place) include:

A healthy property: Mulching recycles nutrients into the soil to feed lawns and plants, provides a free natural fertilizer, and helps retain moisture.

Saving time and effort: Mulching leaves in place is easier and faster than raking or blowing them to the curb.

Helping the environment: Transporting and disposing of leaves wastes energy and contributes to pollution. Also, leaf piles block streets and traffic, clog storm drains, and result in excess nutrient runoff (phosphorus & nitrogen) polluting our waterways.

All materials must be placed at the curbside by 7 AM. For the summer months only (Memorial Day through Labor Day / May 26 - September 1, 2014), all material must be placed at the curbside by 6 AM. GARBAGE & TRASH

- Garbage must be placed in garbage cans no larger than 32 gallons and weigh no more than 75 pounds
- Heavy duty plastic bags may be used but weigh no more than 75 pounds
- Brown leaf/yard waste bags are **NOT ACCEPTABLE** for garbage

Mattress Pickup: Mattresses and box springs placed at the curb for refuse collection **MUST BE WRAPPED** in a disposable mattress bag and sealed with packing tape.

Appliances & Heavy Metal Items

COLLECTION SCHEDULE: WEDNESDAYS

BY APPOINTMENT ONLY

Call the Bureau of Sanitation prior to 12 noon on the Tuesday before collection at 914-235-3593. Place items curbside by 7 AM (6 AM during summer months).

Refrigerators, freezers or air conditioners require a sticker for Freon removal* prior to pickup

- Freon removal stickers are sold at the City Clerk's office at City Hall (phone 914-654-2159) for \$25
- After obtaining the sticker call 914-235-3593 to schedule an appointment for pickup
- Place sticker on the refrigerator, freezer or air conditioner and place items curbside by 7 AM (6 AM during summer months). There will be no appliance pickup during holiday weeks.

* As an alternative, residents may have their own licensed contractor remove the freon gas and place their company sticker on the appliance.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

THESE MUST NOT BE DISPOSED OF IN GARBAGE OR RECYCLING

- Containers used for hazardous material, aluminum siding, paint cans, scrap metal wire, pipes, tubing, motors, sheet metal and automobile parts
- Radiological Medical Residual - Return them to the hospital or health care facility where you or your pet received treatment. For further information call Westchester County's Hotline 914-813-5425
- Hazardous Materials of all types including ALL Fluorescent bulbs. Violators are subject to fines and/or prosecution.

Newspapers, glossy inserts; colored, glossy periodicals, merchandise catalogs, magazines, telephone books, junk mail

- Do **NOT** tie papers or magazines
- Corrugated or gray cardboard such as cereal and pizza boxes can be flattened and tied into bundles OR mixed with paper collection
- Paper/cardboard recycling must be placed in garbage cans no larger than 32 gallons; or paper grocery bags. **PLASTIC BAGS, BROWN LEAF/YARD WASTE BAGS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE.**
